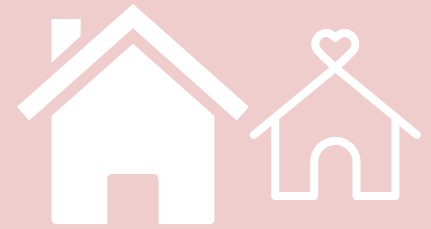


RESIDENCE PERMIT



- 👉 Pay the first instalment of the tuition.
- 👉 The admission letter and scholarship certificate will be sent to you upon request
- 👉 Apply early via this link: www.migrationsverket.se.
- 👉 An insurance is not needed since you will stay in Sweden for more than one year.
- 👉 Keep in mind that applying for a residence permit will cost you SEK 1,500.

HOUSING



SSE housing

You have the chance to secure a primary contract for an apartment with our partner SBS.

SSE administer a limited amount of student apartments for international students. They are in brand new buildings (from last year) and fully furnished.

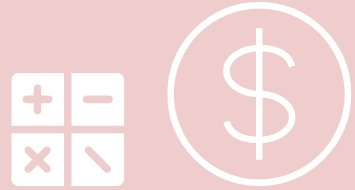
Student housing in Stockholm

COSTS OF LIVING



Food:	2,000 – 3,000 SEK
Accommodation* :	5,000 – 10,000 SEK
Local travel:	650 SEK
Telephone/internet:	400 SEK
Insurance/medical care:	300 SEK
Hobby/leisure:	1,500 SEK
Total:	<hr/> 9,850 SEK – 15,850 SEK

*The lowest cost is for shared housing. A furnished studio apartment range from SEK 7,000 – SEK 10 000.

As a comparison, Swedish Migration Agency have a maintenance requirement is of at least 10,656 SEK per month.

PERSONAL IDENTITY NUMBER



- 👉 You apply once you are **enrolled** as a student, at your local tax office.
You need to have an address where you can receive mail.
- 👉 Once the application is approved, you will receive your personal identity number ("personnummer").
- 👉 We will send you additional information about the personal identity number in August.

MEDICAL CARE IN SWEDEN

- 👉 Students studying longer than one year, with a personal identity number, are entitled to use public medical services on the same basis as Swedish residents.
- 👉 SEK 275 for a visit to a generalist, SEK 275 for a specialist, SEK 400 for emergencies.
Max SEK 1,450 per year → free card
- 👉 Max SEK 3,800 for medication per year.
- 👉 Dental care is not included.



STUDENT LIFE AT SSE & IN SWEDEN



SSE's student association SASSE is one of the most active associations in the Nordic region and will offer many activities and opportunities, including company presentations, fairs, events, trips, sports activities and tournaments – just for you.

The heart of SASSE is located at the basement of Sveavägen 65, occupying the bottom floor of the main university building. Here, you will find each committee and some projects with their own room, a student Pub and their club, the Rotunda.

DEFERRAL AND REFUNDS

Deferrals policy

Postponements are approved if exceptional grounds exist. Examples are hospital stay, death of a family member, parental leave or an illness which prevents the student over a long period from completing her or his studies. Employment or the responsibilities incumbent upon the student are not considered exceptional grounds.

Refunds policy

If the student is impeded from participating in the program and exceptional grounds exist, decision on the eventual refund is taken by the President.

THINGS TO DO BEFORE ENROLLMENT

BSC STUDENTS

- 👉 Look for housing opportunities in and around Stockholm.
- 👉 Send your final high school transcripts and diploma to University Admissions. We can confirm if you fulfil the grade / course requirement only when your grades have been officially converted by them.
- 👉 Sign up for summer math and Swedish (not mandatory, but highly recommended).

IB Students

For University Admissions to access your IB results, you must ask the IB coordinator at your school to make your results available through **the IB's Result Service**.

When your coordinator submits your results with via IB's Results Service, they must use **recipient code "UHR"**

(**U**niversitets- och **H**ögskole**R**ådet = Swedish Council of Higher Education).

The coordinator must make your results available to University Admissions **by July 5th**.

E-mail us at SSE your notification of results/statement of results as soon as you get them in August.

When you get the official GCE certificate from the Examination Board later during the autumn semester, you upload that with your account with UniversityAdmissions.se and send us an e-mail to let us know it's done.



All other countries: Make sure to read what documents that you need to submit on [University Admissions' web](#).

Documents issued in English, French, Spanish, German, Danish, Norwegian, Swedish and Finnish do not need to be translated. If your documents are in any other language, you must also submit an official translation of the documents into Swedish or English.

You can normally upload the documents yourself, unless you graduate with an American High School diploma. Then your American High School needs to send the official transcripts from an official email address to verifications@uhr.se
