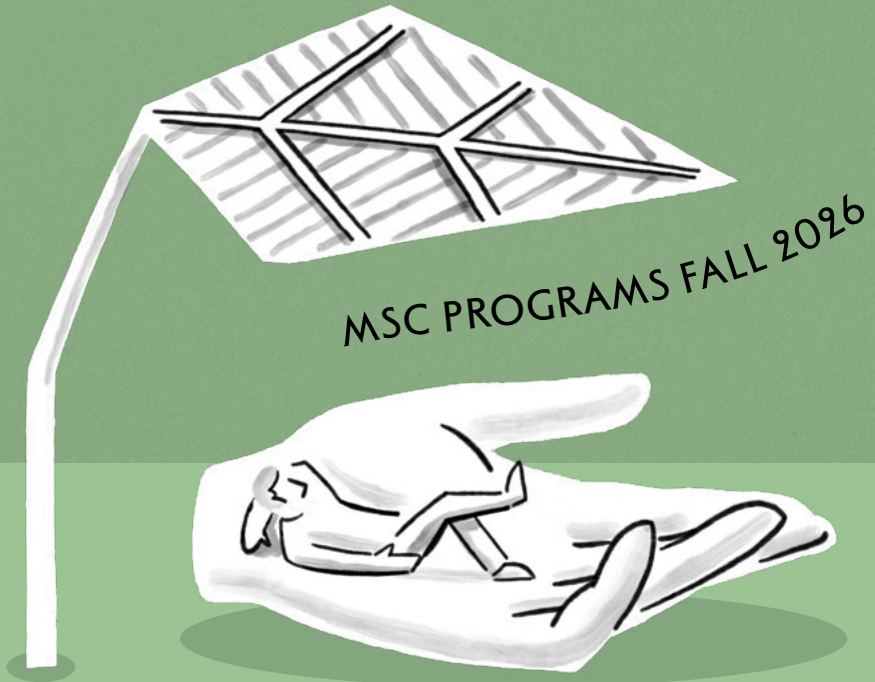

REGISTRATION AND INTRODUCTION

There is a lot to think about when beginning a new educational program. For you to get your bearings quickly and easily, we have compiled this Student Compass. Here, you can find brief information about the structure and content of the program and what applies at SSE, as well as references for where you can find more detailed information. Hold on to the compass – it can be good to have as a reference!

Pre-registration

The pre-registration to the program is done online. The pre-registration form will be open from June 1 to August 20. You are required to fill in the form, sign the student pledge and confirm that you are done with the Bachelor's program. When you come to the school and your program for the first time, you are required to show your ID and pick up your login details to the SSE Sharepoint.

Introduction

Program start date: Students who are new to SSE will start on August 26, 2026. Followed by the start date for everyone on August 27.

You are welcomed to SSE by the school's management team, representatives from the professional services units and the Student Association (SASSE), followed by the academic introduction by your program director and their team. You receive an introduction to SSE, your program, SASSE, and get to know your new classmates and other students at SSE.

The purpose of these days is to create a solid foundation and to set a positive atmosphere for the two intensive study years to come. Expect full days packed with activities. Please note that the introduction is mandatory for all students.



Important documents

SSE is a private institution of higher education and differs in some respects from its state-run counterparts in Sweden. We have two important documents that will guide you through the studies:

- MSc Student Handbook
- MSc Degree Requirements

It is important that you are aware of the SSE Academic Regulations, which can be found in the MSc Student Handbook. When registering at SSE you sign a student pledge which, among other things, confirms that you accept the school's rules about the minimum number of credits required and exam procedures and that you, at all times, will act as a good ambassador of SSE. A copy of this pledge is enclosed in the MSc Student Handbook for your reference.

All educational programs at the Stockholm School of Economics are based on research and stress a theoretical and analytical approach.

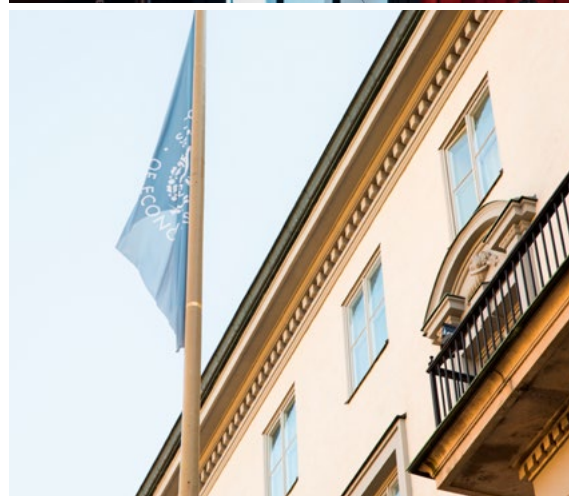
Teaching methodology

the teaching methodology is a mixture of American and European teaching methods and theories. Some modules are characterized by more traditional teaching, with lectures, written course assignments and seminars. In others, the teaching is based on cases; active participation in class is expected and contributes to the final grade. Many of the course modules require substantial preparatory reading.

As an SSE student, you are part of a student body of about 1800 active students. You may find that the structure of examination differs from what you are used to. SSE exams put great emphasis on not only understanding the material from the respective module, but also being able to connect and integrate learning across different topics.

SSE Academic Year

The SSE academic year consists of two semesters, fall (August–December) and spring (January–June), each worth 30 ECTS credits. Every semester consists of two periods, and you study two courses in parallel every period. To complete the program, you will have to pass a total number of 120 ECTS credits. Exact dates for each period, semester and exam week can be found on SSE Share-point.



OUR MISSION – YOUR EDUCATION

The Stockholm School of Economics' education mission is based on the view that the decision makers of tomorrow will approach the world with curiosity and confidence.

In terms of processing capacity, future decision makers will often be outperformed by artificial intelligence, robots, and machines. However, the human beings core competence is to be human, and SSE's new learning objectives, or Educational Mission reflects this. The decision makers of the future will be those who make use of their human potential. Accordingly, SSE has formulated its Educational Mission with the abbreviation FREE, which stands for:

Fact and science based mindset

We are fundamentally a scientific institution, and facts are the basis for all critical and analytical thinking. An SSE graduate will make decisions based on facts and have the ability to differentiate between types of knowledge. This ability becomes particularly important in a world of alternative facts, "fake news" and filter bubbles.

Reflective and self aware

the future will require more reflection and self-knowledge. SSE-trained individuals will be able to contemplate what role they play in the world, understand the impact they have on others, evaluate their personal preferences, and be aware of how their choices are determined.

Empathetic and culturally literate

empathy and cultural sensitivity are so far, something that artificial intelligence cannot accomplish. We are convinced that an empathetic person becomes a better leader and decision maker; thus we hope our students will be able to consider the perspective of others fully. Cultural literacy is also critical. To interact with someone from another background, expertise, or profession than one's own is a prerequisite for the future.

Entrepreneurial and responsible

students graduated from SSE will have an entrepreneurial and creative approach to the world. They will strive to create change in a responsible manner. They should not accept the status quo but seek improvement for society and the world at large.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION



SSE Sharepoint

[SSE Sharepoint](#) gives you access to your personal records and information about your studies at SSE. You will get full access to the SSE Sharepoint during the registration days in August.

On the home page “Programs”, you will find your program news and a link to your SSE e-mail account etc.

By clicking on the tab “Courses” you will go to the page “My Courses”. This page contains information about all courses, seminar groups and exams you are currently registered for. It is also the home page for seminar and exam registrations and withdrawals.

All your course results are to be found on the page “My Results” which you can reach through the tab “Courses”. On the page “My Certificates” you can download transcripts and certificates.

On the site “Support” you will find information such as how to connect to the wireless network, information about exchange programs, study counseling, how to order official transcripts, how to apply for a degree certificate etc.

Via the “Tools” menu you can for example register your contact details, in case of emergency info, change password and get credentials to the wireless network eduroam.

Office 365

As a student at SSE, you have access to Microsoft Office 365. Please note, that the offer applies to active students. Within Office 365 you have access to several services, which give you the opportunity for collaboration and communication. As a student you have a 1 TB storage space for your files in the cloud. Please keep in mind that you are responsible for the materials you upload on OneDrive and handle of the applications.

SSE e-mail

As a part of Office 365, you will obtain a personal e-mail address at SSE, based on your registration number which is given to you during the registration in August. If your registration number is for example 80004, your e-mail address will be: 80004@student.hhs.se. You can reconfigure your account to the mailing software on your own computer or laptop. Instructions are found on Student IT Support web site and help is available at the service desk. All communication between a student and SSE is conducted via the student e-mail address. This is to verify students’ identities. Important or sensitive information is always sent to the student e-mail address and can never be disclosed to private e-mail addresses.

You are not allowed to sign up for any mailing lists, online retailers or services as a registration name or contact details with this account.

“My contact details”

When you have received your SSE registration number during the registration, it is of great importance that you register your postal address and phone number on the intranet.

If you change your address while staying in Stockholm, you are responsible for updating it on the SSE Sharepoint.

Various information is sent to the postal address you have registered: general information, invitations to the events, grade transcripts etc. The Student Association may also, if they consider it to be in the interest of the students, allow commercial distribution. You are, however, able to decline these offers. It is also common that companies contact various categories of students for recruitment purposes.

Please make sure to also register your contact information In Case of Emergency (ICE).

Course information

You can find general course information in the SSE course catalog.

Registrations

Courses: All new students are automatically registered for the courses during the first fall term. For the following semesters, you will have to register yourself for the courses you intend to attend. This is done on the page “My Upcoming Courses”. Please note that you are obliged to withdraw from courses you will not attend within three weeks after course period start.

Seminar groups: You register for and withdraw from seminar groups on the page “My Courses”.

Exams: You need to register to attend an examination. Examinations open for registration 30 days after the previous exam period and close for registration 10 days prior to the examination period. Registrations for/withdrawals from examinations are done on the page “My Courses”. This applies to both main exams and potential re-exams.

Exams

On the day of the exam, you will be able to find information on the page “My Exams” about where you will be seated. The information is published at midnight on the day of the exam. You need to be familiar with the SSE exam rules before attending your first exam. They are available in the Student Handbook and on the Support site on the [SSE Sharepoint](#).

You need to bring a valid identification card to be eligible to attend an exam.

If you do not have an ID and sit down at your place in the exam hall it will be counted as a used exam opportunity for that specific course. The exam result will be registered as a Fail.

You are guaranteed examination on the same course content in one re-exam following the main exam. After that the content may be altered.

Access cards & security

As a student at SSE, you will have access to our facilities located in the heart of Stockholm, providing proximity to a variety of cultural events, sports, shopping, and leisure activities. However, being in a central location also requires strict adherence to security procedures to ensure the safety of everyone on campus.

Access cards: All SSE students are required to purchase a personal access card to enter the school premises.

The access card is strictly personal and must not be shared or lent to anyone. Sharing your card violates security policies and could result in disciplinary action.

The card provides access to specific areas of the campus, including study rooms, lecture halls, and other facilities.

Using your access card: Always carry your access card with you while on campus. Report a lost or stolen card immediately to the administration to prevent unauthorized access. A replacement card can be issued for a fee.



Security awareness: Ensure that doors close properly behind you after entering or exiting to prevent unauthorized access. Do not let strangers follow you through secure entrances (a practice known as “tailgating”).

Be aware of your surroundings and report any suspicious activity to campus security.

Introduction and support: Detailed information about access cards, security procedures, and how to use the facilities will be provided during the introduction days. If you have questions or require assistance with your access card, contact the administration.

Respect campus rules: The security of our campus depends on the cooperation of everyone. Follow all posted guidelines and respect security protocols. Misuse of access cards,

such as lending them to others or attempting to bypass security measures, compromises campus safety and will be addressed seriously.

By following these procedures, we can maintain a secure and welcoming environment for all students, staff, and visitors. Thank you for your cooperation in keeping SSE a safe place to learn and grow.

OPTIONAL PROGRAM COMPONENTS

MSc students can choose only one optional component from the offerings below. Participation in one of them excludes the possibility for admission to the others.

Fire alarm information

In the event of a fire alarm activation, it is essential to act quickly and follow established procedures to ensure everyone's safety. Please read and familiarize yourself with the following guidelines:

Evacuation procedures: When the fire alarm sounds, immediately stop all activities and proceed to evacuate the building. Do not assume it is a drill. Follow the designated evacuation routes indicated by the green EXIT signs and directional arrows throughout the building. Familiarize yourself with the evacuation routes and exits in all areas of the building you frequent. Emergency evacuation maps are posted on walls in hallways and common areas for easy reference. After exiting the building, proceed to the designated assembly points located outside and at a safe distance from the building. Assembly points are clearly marked and noted on evacuation maps. Remain at the assembly point until further instructions are given by emergency personnel or authorized staff.

General safety tips: Always use stairs during an evacuation; elevators should never be used in case of fire. If you encounter smoke, stay low to the ground and move quickly to the nearest exit. Assist others who may need help evacuating, including those with mobility challenges, if it is safe to do so.

In advance: Take time to review the evacuation maps and locate assembly points before an emergency occurs. Being prepared can save valuable time during an actual evacuation. Participate in any fire drills or safety training offered by SSE to better understand evacuation procedures.

Important reminders: Do not return to the building until it is declared safe by emergency personnel. Report any blocked exits or malfunctioning fire safety equipment to the administration immediately. By being prepared and following these steps, we can ensure a safer environment for everyone. Thank you for your cooperation and commitment to safety.

IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO GO ABROAD

MSc Student exchange program

MSc students can go on exchange to one of SSE's prominent partner universities. Most of our academic partners are members of the networks Erasmus+, PIM (Partnership in International Management) and/or CEMS (The Global Alliance in Management Education).

MSc students can go abroad for one semester (fall or spring) during the second year. A vital part of the exchange program is of course that SSE receives students from all over the world every year. The student group in most courses will consist of a mixture of SSE and exchange students. For more information, please see www.hhs.se or on SSE Sharepoint after the enrollment.

CEMS Master's in International Management

SSE is the only CEMS member school in Sweden. CEMS is the Global Alliance in Management Education, an alliance of leading business schools and multinational companies. The CEMS MIM is a one-year degree program that is available exclusively to Master students enrolled in the CEMS schools who also must meet strict selection criteria. The CEMS degree is only awarded in conjunction with the home school degree. For more information, please see hhs.se and cems.org. This option is not available to students in the MSc program in Business Innovation.

Double degree program in Finance with Bocconi

Students within the MFIN program can apply for a double degree program arranged between SSE and University Commerciale Luigi Bocconi, Italy. Students enrolled in this program spend their second year at Bocconi and must fulfill additional requirements in order to graduate from both schools. Double degree program in Banking and Finance with St. Gallen

Students within the MFIN program can apply for a double degree program arranged between SSE and HSG, the University of St. Gallen, Switzerland. Students enrolled in this program spend their second year at HSG and must fulfill additional requirements in order to graduate from both schools. Double degree program in Economics with St. Gallen

Students within the MECON program can apply for a double degree program arranged between SSE and HSG, the University of St. Gallen, Switzerland. Students enrolled in this program spend their second year at HSG and must fulfill additional requirements in order to graduate from both schools. Wallenberg International Fellows Program

The Wallenberg International Fellows Program offers three exceptionally qualified SSE MSc students an opportunity to combine an exchange semester in the Landegger Program in International Business Diplomacy at Georgetown University with an internship in Washington, D.C. organized by Georgetown University, as well as a cohort experience interaction with the three Wallenberg Fellows from Georgetown. The Landegger Program is an honors program in the Edmund A. Walsh School of Foreign Service. The internship segment of the program will take place in the summer between the first and second years of Master's studies, followed by studies at Georgetown during the fall. Wallenberg fellows from both schools will spend time together during the program to increase and deepen the cross-cultural experience and build networks. IF YOU STAY IN SWEDEN

Elective courses

During the second year, students who stay in Sweden choose from a range of elective courses at SSE, offered by different departments.

Some students choose to take courses at the Stockholm School of Entrepreneurship that unites the region's top academic institutions in medicine, technology, economics, design and humanities: Karolinska Institutet (KI), the University College of Arts, Crafts and Design (Konstfack), the Royal Institute of Technology (KTH), the Stockholm School

of Economics (SSE), Stockholm University (SU) and the Royal College of Music (KMH). As a natural and integrated part of each of the member schools, SSES complements the educational programs and offer students the chance to study in diverse environments outside their home institutions.

GNAM

Through the Global Network for Advanced Management (GNAM) we can offer our second-year students to take open elective courses, offered by the member schools.

The courses are offered online and connect students from multiple member schools during lectures, discussions, and collaborative team projects, developing teamwork skills and cross-cultural perspectives. Read more [here](#).

CIVICA

CIVICA brings together ten leading European higher education institutions in the social sciences, humanities, business management and public policy, with a total of 72,000 students and 13,000 faculty members. Together, they build on an ever-stronger combination of teaching, research and innovation to mobilize and share knowledge as a public good and to facilitate civic responsibility in Europe and beyond. SSE MSc students have the chance to join CIVICA activities at CIVICA partner universities through Honor Seminars (HS), multi-campus courses (MCC), joint courses (JC) and CIVICA digital mobility courses. Students who successfully passed courses/seminars will receive certificates from the CIVICA alliance. You will find more information here www.hhs.se

XTM

The Executive Trainee Module (XTM) is a 20-week/30 ECTS/full semester module which substitutes the elective courses in the program. The model builds on two elements. Firstly, students will be given the opportunity to experience a tailor-made executive trainee program in a partner company. Secondly, students are required to write an academic case report on how to solve a real and complex problem of strategic importance to the company. The course is offered only in

the fall cannot be combined with the Student Exchange Program, the MSc program in International Business, the MFIN internship course, any of the double degree programs or the Wallenberg International Fellows Program. For more information, please see hhs.se.

MSc-PhD parallel enrollment

First-year MSc students, who have already decided that they want to pursue a PhD after the MSc studies, can be admitted to SSE's PhD program through the MSc-PhD parallel enrollment track. If you are accepted to the PhD program, you begin your PhD studies in the coming fall semester and have some of the PhD courses counted towards your MSc degree as well. To start the PhD program in the fall, all parallel enrollment MSc students must have achieved 60 ECTS during the first year of their MSc studies.

Parallel enrollment allows you to shorten the time spent on your MSc and PhD studies at SSE from 6 years in total (2+4 years) to 5 years but requires that you are disciplined and keep an adequate study pace in order to succeed. The process for applying to MSc-PhD parallel enrollment track is the same as the standard process for applying to SSE's PhD programs. This means that a first-year MSc student seeking parallel enrollment fills in the application to the best of their ability, despite likely not fulfilling certain requirements at the time of application. Please note that SSE MSc students compete with all other applicants for a spot to the PhD programs.

Data Analytics Track

The Data Analytics Track is a combination of existing courses at SSE. Upon the successful completion of the coursework, a note regarding the completion of the Data Analytics Track is included in the degree certificate.

The courses must be studied only at SSE. It is not possible to transfer courses taken either at a partner university during Exchange or Double degree programs, or other universities.

Students are required to have basic knowledge in the programming language Python and choose three other relevant courses from a stipulated list. More information will be given to you during the fall semester.

It is not possible to take both the Data Analytics Track and the Sustainability Track.

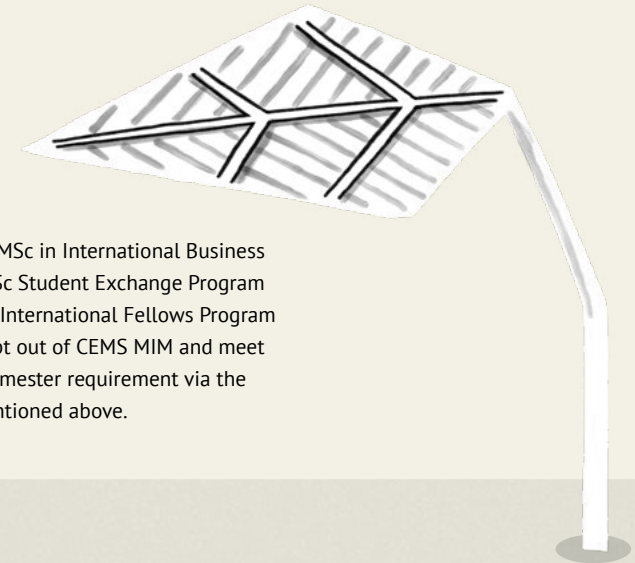
Sustainability Track

The Sustainability Track is a combination of existing courses at SSE and is open to all MSc students. Upon the successful completion of the coursework, a note regarding the completion of the Sustainability Track will be included on the degree certificate.

The track is open to all MSc students who are interested in the topic of sustainability and would like to add a sustainable orientation to their academic profile.

Students are required to write thesis within sustainability and choose two other relevant courses from a stipulated list. More information will be given to you during the fall semester.

It is not possible to take both the Sustainability Track and the Data Analytics Track.



Students in the MSc in International Business can apply for MSc Student Exchange Program and Wallenberg International Fellows Program and decide to opt out of CEMS MIM and meet the exchange semester requirement via the two options mentioned above.

COURSES OUTSIDE DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

Swedish language courses

Our students do not need to speak Swedish to enroll and succeed in the program as all MSc courses at SSE are offered in English. However, knowledge of Swedish can help you enrich your experience at SSE and in Stockholm. In addition, knowledge of Swedish is essential for anyone hoping to work for a Swedish firm. While the major Swedish organizations operate globally, adopt an international outlook and use English as their corporate language, their operations in Sweden are rooted in the local society and use the local language in many contexts.

Therefore, SSE offers Swedish language classes free of charge to all international students. There are courses for different levels of proficiency. You can register for these courses as soon as you receive your SSE student number. The credits for those courses are not always counted towards the MSc degree, you need to check this in the course information

first. Successfully completed courses that are not counted towards MSc degree are however always listed on a supplement to the degree certificate.

Other courses

SSE also offers several other courses outside the degree requirements. Among them are language courses, courses offered by the Swedish Program (an independent program, sponsored by a consortium of American colleges and universities, and affiliated with the Stockholm School of Economics), tax law, etc. The current list of the courses is available on SSE Intranet.

The credits for those courses are not always counted towards MSc degree, you need to check this in the course information first. Successfully completed courses that are not counted towards MSc degree are however always listed on a supplement to the degree certificate.



PROFESSIONAL SERVICES SUPPORT

Studying at SSE can be rather intense, and it is important that all the practicalities surrounding your study situation work smoothly. We take a sincere interest in the students' well-being and integrity, and you are always welcome to contact SSE staff for any reason. The school has a very strict policy concerning harassments of all kinds, and there are disciplinary measures for violations.

Info Center

If you have questions but do not really know where to turn, you are very welcome to visit Info Center located in the Atrium in the main building. The Info Center can provide certificates and transcripts, has general information about the school and if you lost something there is a lost & found box. Library

SSE's Library is a fully equipped research library open to students, researchers and the general public. It covers the fields of business administration and economics, but also has collections in law, statistics and social sciences. The library is in the historic part of the building and is famous for its beautiful book tower. With a lot of study places, it's a popular spot among students.

The collection is acquired in collaboration with SSE researchers and contains digital as well as printed resources. The library subscribes to virtually all major academic journal databases and also to a majority of databases on statistics and company information. As a student you have access to almost all digital resources both on and off campus. The textbook collection includes a limited set of all course books.

Classes about information search and library resources are held for all bachelor and master students writing their thesis, and the library also offers the possibility to book a librarian for individual tuition. On top of that the library hosts the events like workshops, author talks and lectures on literature and writing.
