One scholarship is available for the academic year 2021/2022, exclusively for applicants from North America (citizens of the United States or Canada).

This scholarship fully covers the tuition fee for the MSc program. Funding for additional expenses, such as living costs, is not included in the scholarship. Deadline for the application is January 15.

FEES AND APPLICATION PROCESS

Tuition fee: SEK 150,000 (approximately USD 16,000) per year for two years.

SSE awards a number of scholarships that are funded by generous private donations. Scholarships are available on a competitive basis for students admitted to one of our five MSc programs. The scholarship application is submitted together with the program application.

All scholarship applications are assessed by a selection committee, taking into consideration the relevance and the quality of the personal motivation, academic excellence, relevant extracurricular activities, program cohort diversity and the distribution of scholarships across all programs.
